Please join us in the most widely attended, two-state GIS conference held in the United States! The 2004 Intermountain GIS Users Conference, sponsored by the Montana GIS Users Group and the Northern Rockies Chapter of URISA, will be held April 19-23, 2004 at the Sheraton Hotel in downtown Billings, Montana. We are offering commercial exhibitors the opportunity to exhibit their products to a large segment of the GIS market from Montana, Idaho and other neighboring states during this conference. The theme of this year's conference is: "GIS – Tools of Discovery".

This will be the eighth consecutive year that Montana and Idaho have combined forces. Each year the conference has been extremely successful due to the cooperative efforts of GIS practitioners in Montana and Idaho, with attendance typically exceeding 300 registrants.

The conference will be held at the Sheraton Hotel in Downtown Billings, Montana. Preconference workshops and Public Night will be held on April 19th and 20th, with concurrent conference sessions on April 21st and 22nd. Post-conference workshops are scheduled for April 23rd. The gathering will feature a keynote address on the mapping methods and instruments used by Lewis and Clark from Ralph Ehrenberg, past director of the Library of Congress Map Division. Former Wyoming Governor, Jim Geringer, nationally acclaimed as an advocate of GIS technology and its critical role in formulating and implementing sound public policy, will also be a featured speaker. Commercial exhibitors will display their products in a large room on the third floor, adjacent to the registration, banquet and conference presentation areas. Vendors should plan to arrive on Monday, April 19th and be set up by 5:00 P.M. Monday night. The cost for exhibitors is \$575 per each 8' by 10' booth, which includes registration for two people and their conference meals. The vendor display area is directly adjacent the reception area for our conference breaks which will feature food and beverages.

In addition to inviting you to attend the conference, there are a number of other activities and programs we would like to encourage you to participate in or contribute to, including:

In the past student prizes and door prizes have included atlases, hats, pins, mugs, T-shirts, buttons and balloons.
- Contribute an item for our auction and/or raffle. Proceeds go to support various GIS programs and scholarships.
- Give a New Technology presentation! We would love to hear from you! As was the case last year, this year's conference will include a vendor track during the concurrent sessions to allow vendors to present new technologies. - Present a technical software workshop. Pre- and Post-Conference workshops will be held on Monday, Tuesday morning, and Friday. This would be an opportunity to connect with your user community to offer hands on training.
